Period: this Report covers a period of two years: from February 2021 to February 2023

Report on the activities of Choose Life Organization

The Choose Life Organization (CLO) is a locally based Non-Governmental organization coordinated by Sister Clementine Ngong and goodwill volunteers.

In accordance with the rules and regulations governing the association, the C.L.O has for some time, been expanding its goals and objectives to other parts of the nation. It has also expanded its objectives and activities to other social groups in Cameroon. These include; youth, women, men groups not leaving out other individual persons.

In other to meet up with these tasks, Reverend Sister Mediatric, Reverend Sister Clementine Ngong the general coordinator of Choose Life Organization organizes workshops and seminars on the training of trainers which aims at building capacities of Rev. Sisters and our co-wokers who work in different communities work in different Communities. The "raison d'etre" is at empowering them to effectively and collaboratively carry out the objectives and activities of the NGO in their various jurisdictions. This was the case in Shisong and Tatum in the North West region, Baham in the West Region. Moulvoudaye, Dzigilao and Gobo in the Extreme North Regions in the Republic of Cameroon. Pitoa in the Grand north.

During the aforementioned workshops and seminars that ran from the 18th of November 2021 to the 25th of February 2022, trainees were elaborately educated on different topics and activities.

First and foremost, participants were brief on the rules and regulations governing the Choose Life Organization. The goals, objectives functions and activities of the organization where made known.

Furthermore, participants where guided, drilled and trained on different aspects such as needs, identification, learning methods and outcomes, monitoring and evaluation, report writing, documentation, project report proposals, writing and a host of others.

Realistically after a period of time when the above mentioned trainings were done, it has started yielding fruits. Feedbacks from Reverend Sisters and their co-wokers trained during the time and their communities depicts that the goals, objectives and activities of the Choose Life Organization have been implemented and functioning in different areas.

These can be justified with different activities that have been carried out and some still ongoing, for example:

In Baham in the West Region, various activities have been undertaken since the 28th of December 2021 till date which include; the formation of youth groups and women

groups where especially youths of good morals and behavioral practices such as the dressing code for the betterment of the society. In such groups especially the women groups, income generating activities are being taught there such as the fabrication of Vaseline and other household needs.

In Shisong in the North West Region of Cameroon, associations have been formed such as those of Women, Youths and those of Widows and Widowers. These groups hold monthly meetings.

During such meetings, training workshops are organized where participants are taught on income generating activities such as the production of Omo, Savon and various types of skin cream. Other lessons include studies on cookery and basic sanitation. Articles produced during such workshops are used in household of participants while excess are sold to purchase other household and basic needs of members. This is one of the main objectives of the Choose Life Organization.

The organization has identified and accessed the needs of vulnerable children and come out with a project proposal on their behalf. Even though with the ongoing crisis in the North West and South West region of the country and little funds, the project is still ongoing. Some of these children have been sent to school while others are being capacitated with skills like carpentry, sewing, hair dressing, shoe mending, building and construction and mechanics. These have greatly boosted the morals, skills and living standard of vulnerable children which is one of the cornerstones of the objectives of Choose Life Organization. It is therefore imperative that the government and other stakeholders involved in such areas put hand in gloves to technically and financially support and implement similar projects so as to improve upon the standards of living of vulnerable. Other activities of the association include visitation of the sick, aged, vulnerable, internally displaced persons, where they provide and comfort them morally and with food items. The association is also engaged in health sensitization that includes the HIV and Covid 19.

In Moulvoudaye a remote village situated at the outskirts of Yagoua in the Far North Region of the Republic of Cameroon, activities have and are also being undertaken by the sisters and the co-workers under the canopy of Choose Life Organization. The population is quite diverse. They include the Toupori, Massai Mu, Musgum, Fulanis and other minor groups. The climatic conditions here are too harsh. The main economic activities of the population here is subsistence agriculture, animal rearing and petty trading. There is little or no birth control that has led to a geometric growth of the population in some families and some areas. Within the population, there are a lot of disabled persons who are being stigmatized. The rate of vulnerability is quite high. There is an abundance of child labour; youths are being abandoned by their parents to feign for themselves. Children are obliged to work for money in order to pay tuition in school or as trainees in different workshops.

It is in these light mentioned above that the branch of Choose Life Organization in Moulvoudaye has identified some of the needs of the people, then come out with a project proposal which aims at ameliorating the living conditions of the population through income generating activities. The project also aims at taking care of the deaf and the dumb in particular and other disables. What is holding the project to be realized is the shortage of finance. It is hoped that once the budget of the project is realized, it will be implemented for the wellbeing of the communities.

At Tatum a village in Tatum under Bui Division, North West Region of the Republic of Cameroon which is one of the areas hit by the ongoing crisis in the North West and South West Region of Cameroon, the Choose Life Organization branch has mostly involved it activities there with social groups. In these groups, income generating activities are being developed and carryout such as farming of cash crops, animal husbandry, buying and retailing of products such as palm oil and a host of others. Activities under the canopy of the Choose Life Organization include sensitization on basic hygiene condition, provision of food and medication to vulnerable and moral upbringing amongst the population. The general cry of all the above mentioned groups is the need for material and financial support which will boost their activities. Such activities will generate more income that will help them to meet up with basic needs of their families. It will also encourage those who have fled the village as a result of the crisis due to economic hardship to return to the village.

For the past four years the association has been involved in identifying disabled and vulnerable persons which include children, women, men (different ages), number of pregnant women and teenagers, Internally Displaced persons and all other categories of persons affected by the crisis. This process is being carried out in the Bamenda city streets and other areas. The purpose of the inquiries is to paint the real picture and identify the needs of persons as a result of the crisis who are suffering enormously. This is to call the attention of stakeholders involved to hastily provide short term and long term solutions to the needy.

Report on the activities of Choose Life Organization in Bafut sub-division

Introduction

Bafut is a sub-division situated at the outskirts of Mezam Division in the North-West Region of the Republic of

Cameroon

For a couple of months beginning from March 2021 till date, the field workers and volunteers of Choose Life Organization(C. L.G) have been in the field to identify and diagnose the disabled and vulnerable persons in order to identify their needs. This exercise is quite pertinent and was deemed necessary by the organization and other stake holders because Bafut is one of the most hit areas with the ongoing Socio political crisis in the North West and South West regions of the Republic of Cameroon. It is worth mentioning that during such crisis, disabled and vulnerable persons are mostly affected.

The categories of disabled persons identified in the Sub Division included those with Cerebral palsy, Cognitive, Albinism, mobility, speech, epilepsy, hearing, physical and visual impediments. Meanwhile children, youths, Internally Displaced Persons [L.D.Ps], the aged, returnees and those whose properties have been loathed or destroyed were identified as vulnerable.

As a result of the vast and enclave nature of the terrain, the Choose Life Organization used the stratified random sampling method in other to come out with its findings. Some of the villages/quarters sampled include, Mankwi, Mankanikong, Mbebeli, Mambu, Bawum, Swie, Mforyaa, Akossia, Manka'a, Nsem, Njibujang, Njimuyah area, Agip, Mbereweh, Akofunguba and Mundum and after that we continued to the four corners of Bafut

Field studies depicts that there is a recognizable representation of disables and vulnerables within the population of the Bafut Sub Division that needs to be carter for. In order to effectively carryout such an activity, various stakeholders were contacted. These included the Fon, Chiefs, quarter-heads, leaders of associations of people leaving with disability. Opinion leaders both religious and traditional For a better understanding of the prevailing situation in the sub-division a brief presentation of some of the disable type and vulnerable case is quite fundamental.

With regards visual impediment, a majority of the population of age group above 50yrs indicated that they were having minor or major problems with their sights. Cases of children and youths below the above mentioned age were also depicted. The situation is worse by the fact that there is no specialized hospital in the sub-division to take care of the situation. This group of person's needs immediate and constant eye check and medication while others need supportive devices such as lenses and white canes. Some of the children and youths of school age already need to start learning brail because the condition of their eyes is deteriorating while others needs reading or corrective lenses. All these are not easy to come by due to economic hardship and the ongoing crisis. It is therefore necessary that the leaders and other humanitarian organizations and donors come into the aid of these categories of persons.

Field studies also depicts that there are numerous cases of epilepsy in the sub-division. This has mostly been attributed to witchcraft hunting by the villagers. This cannot be scientifically proven. A majority of water for household usage in the sub-

division is from springs, streams and rivers that might have been highly contaminated with Bilharzia which causes river blindness and epilepsy. There is therefore a need to carry out proper research to debunk such allegation.

More so most of those suffering from epilepsy do not have access or the means to acquire medication. There is the need for stakeholders concerned to promptly minimize or eradicate the illness.

Even though some cases of children and youths suffering from mobility impediment are being recorded, a majority of this category of disabled persons are identified as the aged. This must have resulted from long distant trekking for agricultural purpose which is the mainstay of economic activity in the population. Farmlands nearby have been over cultivated and the soil render infertile couple with the fact that there is no means to purchase soil additive as fertilizers. In order to have better yields, majorities of the population who are mostly farmers have to trek for long distances, climbing and descending hills which has consequently affected their mobility. More so, using rudimentary tools such as holes and cutlasses, working for hours bending has affected their waist which has resulted to mobility impediment. This category of persons, including Cerebral palsy and those that are physically challenged as a result of an accident or from birth, need medical attention and supportive devices to ease their mobility. They need physiotherapy, armpit clutches, knee caps, tricycles, wheel chairs, artificial legs, calipers and other devices which they cannot easily afford due to the lack of means. It is therefore imperative that such situations should be address by the charitable people and other stakeholders.

Even though they are scarce, cases of albinism were also dictated in the field. This categories of person indicated that there are being stigmatized and looked upon as outcast in the society. Such a situation needs to be looked into.

Other impediments included those of hearing and speech which are also numerically represented in the sub-division and need medical attention or supportive devices to address the situation.

With regards vulnerability, it has mostly resulted with the outbreak of the socio-political crisis ongoing in the Northwest and Southwest of the Republic of Cameroon.

Villagers in all the quarters and villages sampled in the sub-division indicated that their properties have been loathed or destroyed. Farmlands, Workshops, motor bikes, cars, business premises and homes have been loathed, breakthrough or completely burnt down rendering victims vulnerable As a result, these category of persons need shelter and livelihood activities for sustainability. When interviewed such persons said they can rear table birds, thither goats, rear pigs which products could be sold for sustainability. Others indicate the needs for financial support in order to restart their businesses while others required building materials to rehabilitated homes broken down or burnt.

Field results also shows that general economic hardship as a result of the crisis has impoverished and rendered a cross section of the population vulnerable. The youthful population that used to be the economy backbone of the sub-division has fled from the crisis area leaving the aged to feign for them. Fertile farmlands hit by crisis have been abandoned leading to starvation and hunger. Constant shutdowns have impeded economic activities. Loathing and burning down of business premises, commercial motor bikes and cars have been quite detrimental. Inaccessibility and constant fear for the unknown in the periphery has greatly rendered economic activities. Prices of goods and services have sky rocked leaving everyone feeling the pinch of the crisis and economic hardship. As a result, a majority of the population that was independent has been rendered dependent and vulnerable. Basic needs such as foodstuffs, clothing, blankets, kitchen utensils and others are today needed and demanded by the population. This is a call for concern and timely intervention by good will people and other humanitarian organisations in order to improve upon the standard of living of the population.

The youthful population has been greatly tampered upon and rendered vulnerable. There is rampant unwanted pregnancy, rape cases, drug abuse, juvenile delinquency, joblessness and school dropouts with all its consequences.

Deafening and sporadic gunshots, kidnap, intimidation, hostilities, threats has cumulated into psycho trauma and accompanied effects. All of this calls for concern.

A lot of internally displaced persons were also identified during the findings. Some of them have been displaced within and out of the sub-division from hostile to calmer areas. Others are those whose homes have been burnt and some because of economic hardship. This category of the vulnerable faces a lot of difficulties as they find it difficult to sustain life in their new environment. Of recent is the case of returnees, these are those who displaced and are now returning because the crisis has calm down from where they displaced. They need to start economic activities from the crash. Together with LD.Ps they need to be supported with livelihood activities and basic needs to sustain life.

In Bafut there is a minority group made up of the Mbororo's, they claim they are being stigmatized by the indigenes. They have been regulated behind when decision making is concerned. They live a secluded life and are being constantly loathed of their properties with the outbreak of the crisis in the region. They too suffer from economic hardship and do have handicap and vulnerable in their midst. They need to be considered by development stakeholders. They have all escape and come as IDP's in a group in the subdivision.

With such initial findings, the Choose Life Organization thought it necessary to table it to the leaders, humanitarian organizations and other stake holders for prompt actions on its part. Apart from the findings, the Choose Life Organization has already

identified some disables and vulnerable, assess their needs for provisions by field workers in the field. It has provided a lot of counseling to the displaced and affected persons. The organization has also provided mental health and psychosocial support to children and youths. It has also taught preventive activities at community levels through sensitization of conflict affected communities, local authorities and traditional rulers. It has also identified those who need Support to be issued civil documentation and hosts of other activities within its reach.

Having investigated listen to the ordeal and predicaments of disable and vulnerable persons in the sub- division. It will be the delight of the organization and the population in particular, if the leaders and other stakeholders promptly intervene by providing temporary or lasting solutions to the plight of the population enumerated.

The Choose Life Organization's doors are open at all times to contribute and work hand in gloves with all stakeholders to improve upon the standard of living of the population when necessary.

Conclusion

It is worth to mention that the; leaders, donor organizations, non-governmental organization, Elites, goodwill persons of all sorts of life have been carrying-out some humanitarian actions in the subdivision to improve the standards of living and morals of the people during and before the crisis erupted in the area. In this respect, we really wish to appreciate the efforts and activities of The Cameroon Baptist Convention and The Tertiary Sisters of Saint Francis, they have been a laudable partner providing with morals and some logistics. We pray they proceed with their activities in order to better the standards of living of disabled and vulnerable persons in the society

Field investigations however depicts that much and very much still have to be done. Most disabled and vulnerable complained that even though they have been identified; they have not been aided in their demise. Some complained that even when humanitarian actions are provided, it doesn't reach them. This is because some individuals in charge with such activities discriminately choose their own relations and provide them with it. It is their wish that these actions be inclusive so that it can be channeled through locally based organizations that are working hand in gloves with the Fon, chiefs, quarter-heads, disabled, vulnerable and social groups in other that these actions reach the deserving persons and on time. More so, all the earlier mentioned disabled and vulnerable persons need counseling due to multifaceted reason as a result of the crisis. The Choose Life Organization has been doing so, however, its resources for the time being are limited. It is therefore soliciting other stakeholders to support them materially, financially and morally to expand its activities. It intends to carryout intensive and inclusive seminars and workshops with the disabled and vulnerable in all the villages and quarters in different fields such as counseling to force displacement affected persons, provide mental health and psychosocial support to children and their categories, sensitization of

conflict affected communities through the Fon, chiefs, quarter-heads, religious authorities and others. Other needs of the disabled and vulnerable persons. Include supportive devices and basic needs such as foodstuffs, mattresses, blankets, pots, plates, clothing, seeds, hoes, cutlasses, shelter while other need financial support to reestablish their businesses.

All in all as of the period of April 2021 till date, the Choose Life Organization has chosen to enhance this report with some statistics so as to ensure the gamut and different categories of disabled and vulnerable persons we have encountered till date. Even though it is pretty difficult to get the updated statistics with exactitude number of persons encountered in the field. They one provided are a mirror reflection of what we encountered.

Generally we have encountered more than 5000 disabled and vulnerable persons ranging from old men, young men, old women, young women and all sorts of disabled persons. Incorporated to this report are the personal needs assessments of persons encountered and their needs.

CHOOSE LIFE GENERATION IN THE BAFUT SUB-DIVISION

Bafut sub-division is the largest sub-division the in the North West Region. This sub-division has suffered and is still suffering the effects of the Anglophone Crises. There are frequent gun shots and people are always on the run. There is general fear and uncertainties around the village. Some parts of bafut are still very dangerous because there are frequent attacks and even killing. There is also general hunger, extreme poverty and real misery. We heard so much about Bafut and Choose Life Generation took a step to go into the communities and families to meet the population

The First Step

We met with the fun of Bafut in his palace. We also met the Bafut traditional council executive; we were then given a plan to follow showing the boundaries of Bafut.

Second Step

We tried to meet all the quarter heads and chiefs of their respective palaces and quarters. We had appointments and days to meet with them.

Third Step

We meet the different chiefs and quarter heads, notables and opinion leaders in their respective quarters. We explained to them our plans and our objectives and how we want

to work in Bafut village. As we met with any of them, a day and a venue was fixed for the meeting in each of the quarters. The chief and the quarter heads helped to inform their population. The meetings were always in three stages. The chiefs, notables and quarter heads with opinion leaders had their meeting always to give us a general view of the quarters.

As the chief and notables and notables finish they usually join the larger group. It is good to note here that even though people fear and have a lot of distrust to come out of their homes; the first comers usually call back to tell their relatives and friends that there is no danger. So usually in 30 minutes the meeting place is always full.

The “We Ring the Bell”

We carried out this activities in the different village communities in Bafut. This was in the presence of traditional rulers, quarter heads, parents, teachers, youths and children.

We “We Ring the Bell” is an activity that helps us to focus on an objective. This is to awaken the consciousness of the general public , all opinion leaders, parents, local authorities on the care and respect of children living with a disability. These children needs to be given their full rights and support just like the other children.

Considering the fact that Bafut is a war zone and the population has and is still going through a lot through the experiences of war and violence, we thought is wise to include the following topics for discussion which at the end we discovered that parents and children were fully involved and

participated very well. The topics are;

1) Stories of the vulnerable children in your communities

Purpose: to help the participants to identify vulnerable children in their own communities

2) To enable participants to think more deeply about vulnerable children by exploring the different experiences of the children

3) To foster a relaxed atmosphere and group formation by working together in a psychodrama- A full group discussions. Some special were used that represent various scenarios which depict problems frequently encountered by children in their community. For examples

- Killings
- Deaths
- Parents taken away
- Burning of homes and property
- Children drop out of school
- Children living in extreme poverty

- Children being victims of sexual and physical abuse.
- Children living in hunger.

The Procedure

We divided the groups into small groups and each selected a topic and acted out.

After, we had a discussion about the experiences that vulnerable children may face in their day to day lives as well as the major stress which they have been through.

Focus attention on the feelings which they have and on the links between their feelings, thoughts and behaviours.

We also tried to do something about “**Resilience**”, to introduce some key factors in promoting resilience in children who have experience hardship and adversity.

Resilience is a term that is a term that is used to help us to understand how children can recover from adversity. It is about the capacity of children to recover and go on with their lives in a positive way despite what ever set back they have experience. We must not forget that every child will need support, no matter how strong they may seem to be. Every child has some major of resilience but this need to be build up.

Procedure

Here all the participants are asked to discuss the external factors that help to promote resilience in children. During their discussions the following points were brought out

1. A close and secured relationship with the care giver
2. A close relationship with the remaining and extended family members
3. Enough food, shelter, clothing and medical services
4. Education
5. Financial stability
6. Close link to ones cultural community

The participants have a good discussion and honest sharing about their own experiences about their own resilience. They talk about some forms of adversities in their own childhood, what or who helped them to be who they are today. They discussed some of the external factors that were important in their situation.

The last stage was a group discussion. This discussion and sharing was to be focusing internal factors which promote resilience. We discovered that in learning to connect and talk with children we will be aiming to help develop internal resources which wil help the child to develop three positive attitudes namely;

- ✓ I have: trusting relationship structures and rules at home like role models, encouragement, social; and interpersonal skill, religion, faith.

- ✓ I am: loved, loving, proud of myself, responsible, hopeful and worthy of trust
- ✓ I can: communicate, manage feelings and impulses, seek trusting relationships

Applying the Golden Rule to Children

Purpose: to explore the implications of the golden rule for our relationship with children

Procedure: read Mathew 7:12 “Do for others what you want them do for you. This is the meaning of the law of Moses and the teachings of the prophets”. This verse has become known as the “Golden Rule” of behaviour. If we apply it to the relationship between adults and children, it will mean trying to understand and respect the child’s feelings in other words putting ones self into the child’s shoes. Children are new to the world and they have special need for protection and care depending upon their ages and their stages of development. We adults sometimes forget what it is to be small, weak and dependent on others. The world can seem can a very large, strange and hostile place to the child.

To have the love, support and protection of at least one significant adult can make all the difference to the child chances in life.

Effects of Circumstances on Children

To explore understanding of the different effects of the circumstances on children depending on their age; the whole group had a very serious discussion and came out with the following

- ❖ The children will have different effects
- ❖ Feeling lonely and abandoned
- ❖ There is a feeling of loss
- ❖ Rejection

Considering the fact that Bafut is a zone in crises and many people that is adult, youth and even children are wounded, we did group counseling.

Why this group counseling?

- ✓ It provides an opportunity for individuals to discuss and learn facts on issues that may have otherwise be sensitive to discuss at individual levels.
- ✓ It enables individuals to discuss issues that can promote their health. This involves conducting health education talks on nutrition, patient care, hygiene etc
- ✓ It provides people with an opportunity to learn about issues together, which can enhance the process of behavior change in a given society
- ✓ It enables the clients to share different experiences and opinion and to identify and share with others facing the same similar challenge
- ✓ It helps the counselor to maximize the use of limited time

- ✓ It protects clients who may not be ready or capable of an individual session by assuring them that they are not alone.
- ✓ It contributes to the process of de-stigmatization of issues by making it a group concern

Conscious that children were also part of these groups, we discussed things to the interest of the children,

It was a wonderful experience to see the people very involved in their discussion. We noticed that the people will need meetings and sessions of this nature.

General Observation

It is very sad to notice the following in Bafut

- ❖ Too many epileptic patients; adults, youths and children alike. The treatment to them does not seem to be the best. They take one particular drug for years without any good medical checks like scan, EEG. Their conditions are getting worst
- ❖ The problem is alarming. Too many persons are visually impaired including children. It is a call for concern
- ❖ C.P children are also many in Bafut and have not had good care. The patients complain of financial difficulties. Some started treatment and abandoned because of lack of money
- ❖ There are lots of retarded growth children too
- ❖ The deaf and dumb are also not to be neglected because they are many of them around the village
- ❖ There are many adults living with different forms of disabilities; some of them need wheel chairs
- ❖ The general observation is that many people have lost property and small business that they were doing; many are homeless
- ❖ A cross section of the children have lost their birth certificates during the crises either burnt or destroyed
- ❖ There are people with elephantiasis.

The Positive Aspects

The people were very cooperating and there was a lot of sharing of ideas and even the most painful events of their lives. We really appreciate their openness. We also appreciate the fun, chiefs, quarter heads and notables who made it easy for us to go round some of the places. We also recognize the presence of the children.

We did home visitation and we met suffering people. Many of the old people are abandon to themselves and have no food to eat

Challenges

- ❖ No means of transport; we did most of the work trekking and our feet are really tired
- ❖ When possible we took a motor bike and this depended on the charity of friends, good hearted people and some of my relatives who wish to extend their love to the suffering
- ❖ We could not go everywhere because the roads are bad and worst in the rainy session
- ❖ We also had a very big challenge with the amba boys
- ❖ We identified children with no birth certificates but it's not possible to get process it not in Bafut

Way Forward

- ✓ We are hoping to be assisted by any charitable person(s), humanitarian organizations so that we can really more.

In this community many people have been displaced and the houses are empty. The few families and their children are in dying need of covid 19 kids for protection and safety measures.

Mr. Ngwa Anthony chenwi

He is 49 years old and is married with 2 children. The children are 19years and 16 years old. He is a farmer but cannot access most of his farms because on the crises

Some challenges faced by this family include;

- ✓ Some members are not schooling and some are jobless.
- ✓ The family lack the basic needs,
- ✓ The children are going to primary school as follows: one in class two and one in the nursery one.
- ✓ It is very difficult to pay their school fees.

Abel Ngwa 2009 at Manji Hospital

Ngum Ritious 2016 at Manji Hospital

- Mother: Fuh Mispa Age 30years.

Small business.

Salt, sweats, oil, biscuits, kerosene, chocolates, omo, savon, matches etc.

Mr. Suh Jeremiah age 1973, lives with a disability on the right hand and the right foot. he is married with two children and lives in the same house with the brother.

He is a tapper who begs from other people's palm bushes before taping. When he does his collections the following day, he supplies to the local palm wine sellers who sale for him but most of the times, it is not sold hence the family staves. Children are often sick and malnourished.

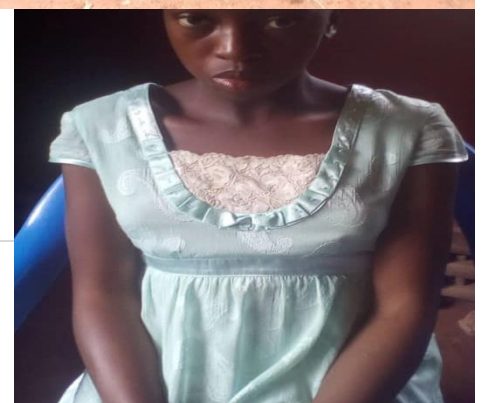

Mforyan is a very risky territory. The people are really suffering and many people have been killed, many went and remain in the bushes for a long time. The quarter is noted as a bad place. No taxi

come into this quarter. “We are often attacked, there is a lot on insecurity and most of our children are missing.. there is no peace in this quarter”.

The people are living in hunger and they are suffering. The quarter head; Mr. Amabo Martin Suh says “many houses were burnt down and even stores, the people are homeless today, all elites ran away and there is still a lot of violence.”

Everybody is suffering in this village, most of the youths have escape and only old parents are mostly there. He was very happy to receive us. The leaders said that Plan International came and helped a few people that are working with them but this population has never received any help. All the markets are closed and farms abandon even with the crops in the farms. There is a lot of hunger. The population is about 3900 people and about 450 households.

Hosiana Manka Che

She is 28 years and an epileptic patient. She has speech defect and she is completely dependent. She has two children; Fonwi Amos is 11 years in class 5 and Miyanwi Blessed is 8 years in class one. She is on phenobarbital but now it is not responding. She will need a very good medical attention because it has never been done. The mother said she was advised to take her to a specialist but she could not go because she had no money that is financial difficulties. She was performing very well in primary school but the sickness started when she was 8 years old. Only the mother takes care of her and her children.

Effects of the war

- They are no transport facilities to even take her to the hospital because all the taxis have escaped from the village. The owners are afraid their cars can be burn. Movement in general is very difficult now in Bafut.
- Lack of food even to feed the children
- They is a lot of shooting which had inflicted fear on the children

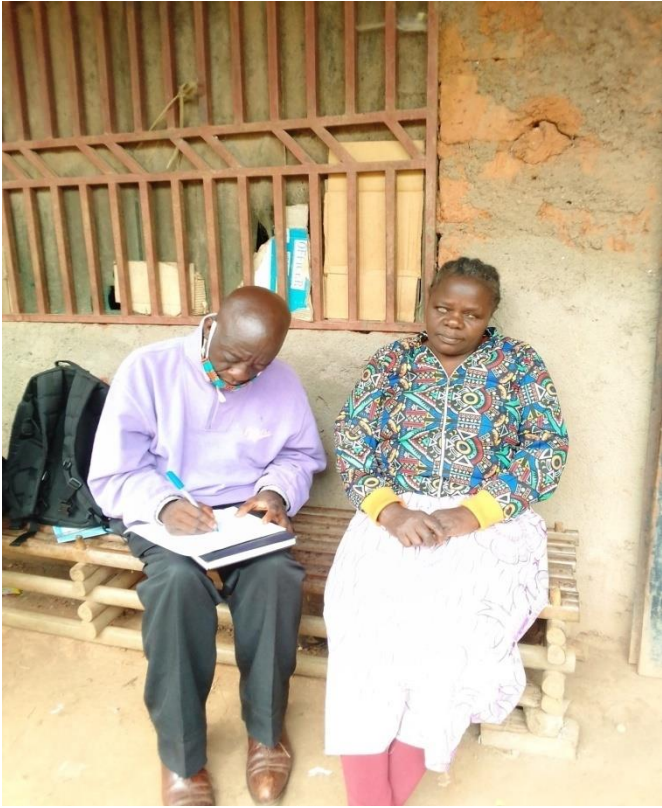

Mr. Ngwa Anthony Chenwi

He is 49 years old and is married with 2 children. The children are 19 years and 16 years old. He is a farmer but cannot access most of his farms because of the crises

Some **Challenges** faced by this family include;

- ✓ Some members are not schooling and some are jobless.
- ✓ The family lack the basic needs,
- ✓ The children are going to primary school as follows: one in class two and one in the nursery one.
- ✓ It is very difficult to pay their school fees.

Abel Ngwa 2009 at Manji Hospital

Ngum Ritious 2016 at Manji Hospital

- Mother: Fuh Mispa Age 30years.
Small business
Salt, sweats, oil, biscuits, kerosene, chocolates, Omo, Savon, matches etc.

Mr. Suh Jeremiah age 73 lives with a disability on the right hand and the right foot. He is married with two children and lives in the same house with the brother.

He is a tapper who begs from other people's palm bushes before taping. When he does his collections the following day, he supplies to the local palm wine sellers who sale for him but most of the times, it is not sold hence the family staves. Children are often sick and malnourished.

The wife is 28 years, she is an epileptic patient and it is very difficult to get her drugs.

Challenges

- ✓ Lack of basic needs like food, medication, clothing etc.
- ✓ The two of them are not really healthy,
- ✓ The children are not going to school at all.

Way Forward:

- ✓ A good pig style furnished with piglets for a start of a new dawn.
- ✓ The wife will need a good medical consultation so as to be placed in a good dose or treatment schedule.

Mama Tangie Odilia Sirri

She is 54 years old and a widow with 3 children, one boy 2 girls. She has one of these tropical wounds since from birth.

They are displaced from her house. The mama is not able to work in the farm again because of too much pain on the left leg.

The child who stays with her is 22 years. She works only in the farm that is small portion of land where they live as IDPs.

Difficulties:

- ✓ They lack basic needs like food clothing, medication etc.
- ✓ She lives with three grandchildren and life is not easy so she sends these children to do hocking for them to survive hence their education is not very sure.

Needs Assessments:

- ✓ There is a need for proper medical attention for the family and for her to get consulted for her ailments and waist pains.
- ✓ Assist the daughter to continue and complete her training in tailoring,

- ✓ Provide her with a sewing machine like zigzag machines, butterfly machine, just to mention a few for sustainability.

Joseph Ngwa

He is 52 years old is not married and suffering from elephantiasis. He is an amputee due to sickness. The other leg has very serious problems too. It is very painful. He stays alone and lives in an old house whose roof is was taken off by fire. So during the rains, he suffers. When he is a little healthy, he cleans some brooms and tries to sell. He can also sew and mend shoes.

Needs assessments:

- ✓ Medical attention
- ✓ An Artificial leg(s)
- ✓ To roof his house with 75 pieces of roofing sheets of 3m.
- ✓ Material for shoes fabrication and mending/repairs.

Che Joseph Akongoh.

He is 76 years old and divorce. He had a child who died, he is visually impaired, and he lives alone and tries to look for what to eat with a lot of stress.

The roofs of the house has been destroyed and all documents taken away, the walls of the house cracked and some fallen. Some friends in the quarter and the church helped him to put up the walls and now rain has come without it being roof.



Needs assessment:

Mama Mbuh Sylvia

She is not married, no children, and visually impaired from childhood. She lives with her junior sister who has four children. Because of her impairments, she then takes care of the children, cleans the house, dishes.

The junior sister and the husband are all farmers and all displaced harbouring another displaced person who is visually impaired.

No taxi come into this quarter. “We are often attacked, there is a lot on insecurity and most of our children are missing.. there is no peace in this quarter”.

The people are living in hunger and they are suffering. The quarter head; Mr. Amabo Martin Suh says “many houses were burnt down and even stores, the people are homeless today, all elites ran away and there is still a lot of violence.”

Everybody is suffering in this village, most of the youths have escape and only old parents are mostly there. He was very happy to receive us. The leaders said that Plan International came and helped a few people that are working with them but this population has never received any help. All the markets are closed and farms abandon even with the crops in the farms. There is a lot of hunger. The population is about 3900 people and about 450 households.

Mr. Ngwa Samuel



He is 83 years old. He is married with 6 children. One child is visually impaired. His name is Ngwa Godlove, he is 44 years old. The wife is a small farmer. Pa gwa has problems with his feet. They are very painful and heavy in a way that he is sometimes

not able to move them. He is also partially impaired visually that is he does not see clearly.

Effects of the war

- Their property was stolen
- Papa was carried out by the arm men and everything taken away.
- They live in great fear because of frequent shooting at night

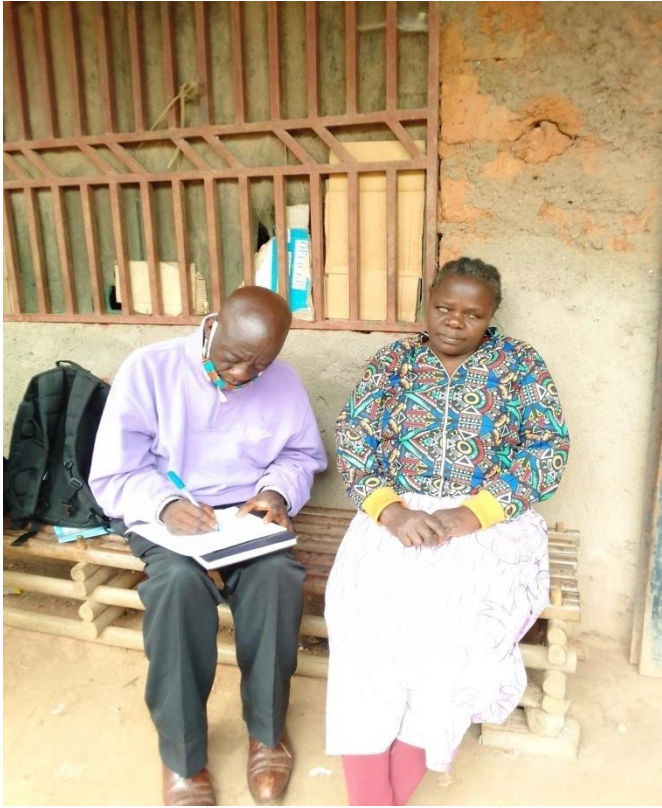
